

Transfer of a prison sentence to another Nordic country (Iceland, Norway, Sweden, Denmark)

If you have been sentenced to imprisonment in Finland, you may have the possibility to serve your sentence in your home country. In this context, home country refers to a Nordic country to which your prison sentence can be transferred once the conditions for transfer are met. The goal of the transfer is to promote your social rehabilitation.

The Prison and Probation Service may also initiate the transfer to your home country on its own initiative.

The transfer procedure usually takes several months.

Conditions for transfer

Your prison sentence may be transferred to another Nordic country if you meet **at least one** of the following conditions:

- you are a national of that Nordic country; or
- you have permanent residence in that Nordic country; or
- you reside in that Nordic country.

In addition, **all of the following** conditions must be met:

- your criminal judgment is enforceable; and
- both Finland and the other Nordic country consent to the transfer, i.e., consider the transfer appropriate.

What happens after the transfer?

If the conditions for transfer are met and the transfer is approved, **you will serve your prison sentence in your home country**. If you are already in prison in Finland, you will be transferred to a prison in your home country to continue serving your sentence.

After the transfer, **the law of your home country will apply**. For example, your release from prison will no longer be determined by Finnish law but by the rules of your home country.

How to apply for a transfer

Apply for the transfer using the **application form** attached to this leaflet.

The prison staff can send your application on your behalf, or you can send it yourself.

Right to counsel and defence counsel

You have the right to use a counsel of your choice. The counsel must be an adult with legal capacity.

You are appointed a defence counsel if you so request. The defence counsel may be an advocate or a public legal aid attorney or, for a special reason, a licensed legal counsel. The fees of the defence counsel are paid from Finnish state funds.

If you request a defence counsel, inform the Prison and Probation Service of the defence counsel's name, contact information and consent to the task (contact information above).

Right to contact your home country's diplomatic mission

As a foreign national, you have the right to contact your home country's diplomatic mission (embassy or consulate). In addition, you must be provided with interpretation assistance where possible. If you wish, you can ask the prison staff to help you contact your consulate.
